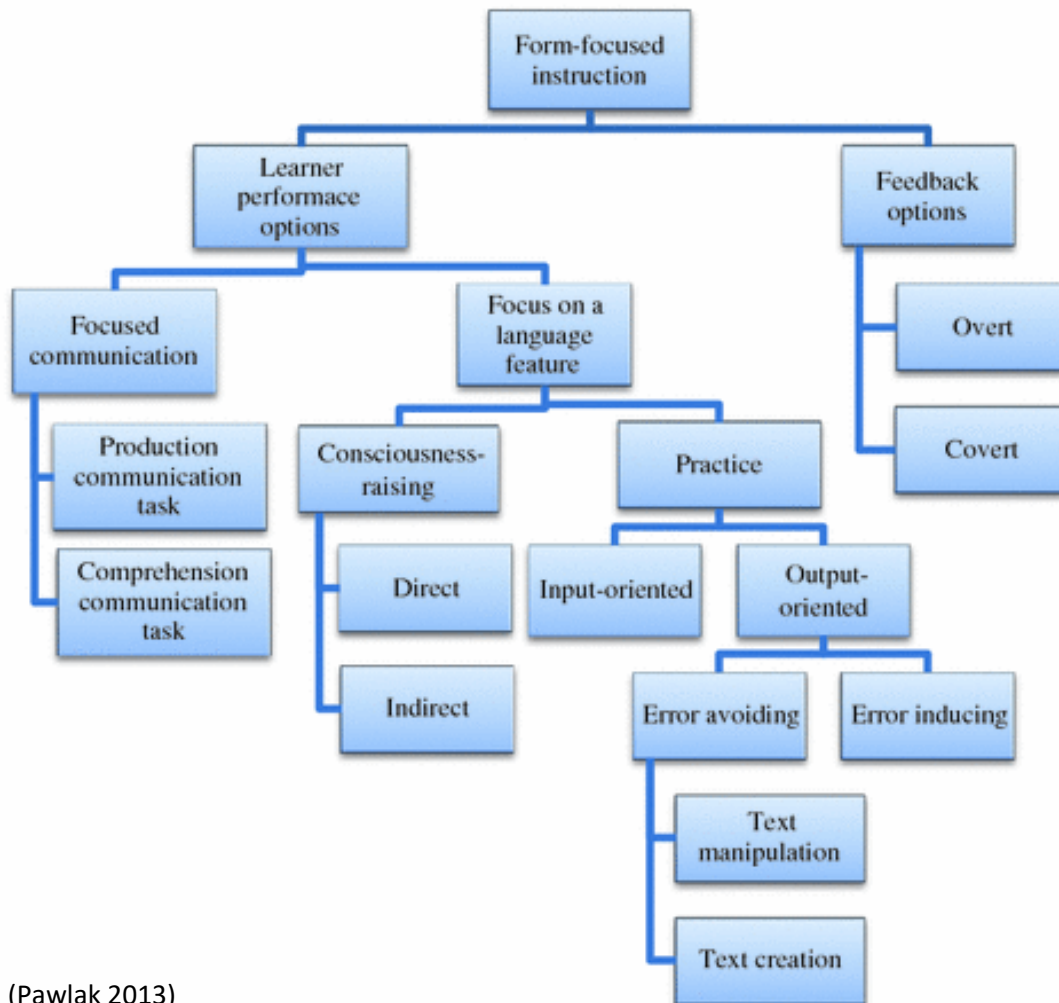

## Communicative Language Teaching

- British European approach, also called 'functional approach'
- Widdowsen (1987), Johnson (1982), Yalden (1983)
- Strongly connected to the development of models of communicative competence
- Focus on interaction, meaning and communicative competence rather than mastery of structures and grammar

## Error Correction and Corrective Feedback

- *They come to my house yesterday.*
- What techniques of error correction do you already know? How would you correct that error in spoken or written discourse?

## Error Correction and Corrective Feedback

- *They come to my house yesterday.*

**Table 1. Examples of the six types of corrective feedback (Chu, 2011, p.455)**

Recast	S: he take the bus to go to school T: he takes the bus to go to school
Explicit correction	S: he take the bus to go to school T: oh, you should say he takes. He takes the bus to go to school
Elicitation	S: he take the bus to go to school T: he? T: how do we form the third person singular form in English? T: can you correct that?
Metalinguistic feedback	S: he take the bus to go to school T: do we say he take? T: how do we say when it forms the third person singular form?
Clarification request	S: he take the bus to go to school T: pardon me?
Repetition	S: he take the bus to go to school T: he take?

## Error Correction and Corrective Feedback

- What kind of/Which mistakes/errors should you correct?
  - Common mistakes many people in the class make
  - Mistakes in the target language
  - Mistakes using language studied in previous units
  - Mistakes that caused problems or ended communication
